Cemetery News

As our Spring cemetery cleanup wraps up and a new season will soon begin, there are a few things that we would like to update everyone on. happy to announce that our grass cutters will be returning this year and remain fully focused on making sure the cemeteries are cut properly and in a timely manner. They did an excellent job last year and will continue to do so this year. We would just like to remind everyone to please keep all plants and/or items close to the stones in order for the grass cutter to move around easily. Reminder: potting soil, weeds, grass, real flowers, anything that is biodegradable, may be dumped in the proper location in the cemetery. We ask that all other garbage be taken home and disposed of. Notice, water in St. Joseph Fountain Springs, will be turned on in the beginning of May. It will be available from the main spout in the old section and the top spout in the old section. Both spouts have been marked orange. Thank you for your cooperation!

Policy Reminders:

2023 Cemetery Policies and Procedures

- 1) Under normal circumstances, all cemeteries will be cut twice a month, this includes cutting the grass, trimming around stones, walkways, and driveways to be cleared of grass trimmings. More cuts per month can occur if there is a holiday and/or other circumstances that require the grass to be cut more often.
- 2) <u>Cemetery cleaning</u> will be done approximately 3 times a year: Spring, Mid-Summer, and Fall. We ask if you have any flowers, etc., that you would like to keep be removed within three weeks of their placement.
- 3) Overturned stones- We understand that this is very dis-hearting to many people when they see that their loved one's stone has fallen. We, as a church, are not responsible for putting the stone back up, unless it has fallen due to the church itself. We, however, will help you obtain the information needed to rectify the stone.
